SEPTEMBER CHALLENGE CUP REPORT (Jim Monaco)

Due to some eye surgery Bob Rice was unable to CD this event, however he did bring all the awards out and Mike Verzuh and I ran the contest. It was a small but very enjoyable event. Only 12 pilots attended this year, with 5 from PPSS and 7 from RMSA. The weather was excellent, and the sprinklers were on the West side posing no problems. Many thanks to the Sod Farm Manager, Kevin who told us to call him before our events and he would do his best to be sure the sprinkler was out of the way for us!!! Thank him if/when you see him!!!

With 12 pilots we were able to run 3 four man groups and everything went smoothly and quickly. Of the 21 flight groups flown that day, 16 were won by RMSA members and 7 were won by PPSS members. You say... Hey Jim – the numbers don't add up!!! Well it must be said that Dr. Dan and I tied for first in the first round and Bob Avery and Charlie Miller tied for first in the seventh round! When the final scores were tallied up, RMSA had once again captured the Challenge Cup retaining bragging rights and most importantly – home field advantage next year.

The top 5 for RMSA were: Bob Lewan, Skip Miller, Cody Remington, Jim Monaco, and Mike Verzuh with a total point score of 34,723. The top pilots for PPSS were: Dr. Dan, Bob Vixie, Bob Avery, Austin Cleis, and John Read. PPSS total point score was 29,185. Bob Vixie had one of his best showings of the year and flew and landed very well. The RMSA team flew very consistently, with the worst score of the top 5 guys being 961.

Congratulations to all that came and flew. I hope we get a better turnout next year though.

RMSA Members Take Wood in F5J World Challenge - by Lenny Keer

A few weeks ago Steve Suntkin, Jon Padilla, Shannon Bingham and myself drove down to Albuquerque for the 2006 F5J World Challenge. This event has traditionally been held in October, but was moved up to August in hopes of better weather. It looks like that was a good move, as we had excellent weather this year. Friday was a practice day for trim flights and sport flying. There were a few rain showers early in the day, but the weather steadily improved and both Saturday and Sunday were just about perfect.

There were four model classes this year. The usual SP400, 7-cell, and unlimited, plus the new "outrunner" class. This new class was very popular and uses small brushless outrunner motors with lipo packs in SP400 size (about 2 meter wingspan, 20 ounce weight) models. The result is a good performing model that is hassle free and is practical to use for sport flying.

The Albuquerque club did a great job of organizing everything and this year the rounds were flown to an automated timing system, similar to our F3J system. This worked very well and kept the contest moving smoothly. We flew 6 rounds in all four classes over the two days and I think everyone had a good time.

Congratulations to Jon Padilla for winning the unlimited class and taking second place in the outrunner class, thus winning the trophy for Grand Champion (highest total score in two classes). Steve Suntkin took the 3rd place plaques in both SP400 class and unlimited. Shannon overcame several setbacks





and came in 4th in SP400 and 4th in 7-cell. I managed to win the SP400 class with my trusty old Mirage conversion (and a borrowed motor, thanks Steve) but had a few technical problems with my Escape, putting me in 4th place in unlimited class.

If you missed this year's contest, you should consider attending next year. It's a well run event and lots of fun!

ROCKY MOUNTAIN SOARING ASSOCIATION FIELD RULES

- 1. The sod farm operations take precedence over **ALL** activities. We use the field at the convenience of the owner.
- 2. All members will follow **ALL** instructions from **ANY** sod farm personnel without question.
- 3. When sod farm operations are occurring during a flying session it is **OUR** responsibility to ensure that we will not interfere with operations. If it is unclear as to what is happening or where they intend to mow or work try to talk to workers or management and always move equipment or vacate the premises if necessary. Some workers do not speak very good English in that case you must make every effort to avoid conflict or interference with operations.
- 4. Park only in the designated parking areas Do not park on grass, dirt or roads.
- 5. Avoid setting up on newly seeded areas or young grassy areas. The nice grassy areas are better to land on anyway!
- 6. Establish a frequency control pole and tag system! Frequency control is to be in effect at all times!! All members will post their frequency control tags on the pole and if there are conflicts, please exercise safety sense as well as share the flight time.
- 7. Parking and pit areas should be as condensed as possible for the safety of launch and landing.
- 8. Establish flight line areas for winch launch, high start launch, and hand launch that are separate for the sake of launch, flight & landing safety.
- 9. Flying over the parking/pit areas at less than 30 feet is prohibited. Doing so in competition WILL result in a zero flight score and during R/R flying a disciplinary action by the club.
- 10. No aerobatics or speed runs over the parking/pit/Launch/Landing zones.
- 11. Do not launch if a plane is circling in a launch zone: vacate the launch zone as soon as possible if someone is waiting to launch.
- 12. When entering a thermal occupied by other aircraft, enter in the same direction as the first aircraft
- 13. Landing aircraft have the right of way!
- 14. In the event of no mechanical retriever, please shag your own chute/line for the flight
- 15. Please share the usage of club equipment so that all have equal flight time.
- 16. Please be courteous and helpful to your fellow flyers as well as informative to all guests/spectators. Enjoy yourself and others!!
- 17. Absolutely no debris or trash is to be left on the field! Please take it home with you for disposal.
- 18. Make sure that your plane and electronics are airworthy before each flight. Exercise good safety sense in your flight
- 19. The aircraft will have an identification name/address or AMA number on or in the model in case of loss.
- 20. You MUST tag your winch/high start spikes or stakes with fluorescent tape so they are easily spotted on the field by all concerned. Members may be fined \$10 for each stake or nail not so marked. Previous damage to sod farm equipment from spikes left in the ground have made this rule EXTREMELY important.
- 21. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages will be consumed, prior to or during participation in any model event on the flying field.
